Ms. Perez delivered the opening address, highlighting the importance of this initiative to the development of trade in the region. He explained the importance of this forum to sensitize both public and private sectors on how cluster development initiatives can provide new avenues for business development and growth and aid in the development of government policies and strategies for the growth and diversification of economies.

The meeting ended on an optimistic note as Secretary General Andrade Falla articulated that the ACS will act in its capacity as a vehicle to improve regional integration among member states.
