GUATEMALA ENDORSES THE WORK OF THE ACS



Port of Spain, Trinidad (August 14th, 2013) – The Honourable Minister of Foreign Affairs of Guatemala, Luis Fernando Carrera, paid a courtesy visit to the Chargé d'affaires a. i. and Director of Sustainable Tourism, Julio Orozco at the Secretariat of the Association of Caribbean States (ACS).
